The Passport Program is an innovative and bold approach to education of the unique learner — a comprehensive model program designed to successfully launch high school Transition or college age students challenged with intellectual and learning disabilities into adulthood.

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The Passport to Success

➤ Research shows that under-prepared students' motivation and self-esteem will actually *increase* by a more challenging curriculum. Emphasizing experiential and community learning, the **Passport** courses use problem solving, cognitive processing, teamwork, and career skills to help students understand both their genius and their challenges.

Who We Serve

➤ The **Passport Program** curriculum and supporting Administrative Resource Guides are designed for individuals who receive extensive special education services, have challenges navigating in a traditional high school or college classroom, and who attain scores below the typical range on specific standardized tests of intellectual ability and academic performance. Students using this curriculum include those within the autism spectrum, high functioning, multiple learning disorders involving reading, mathematics, and expressive writing, and developmental disabilities.

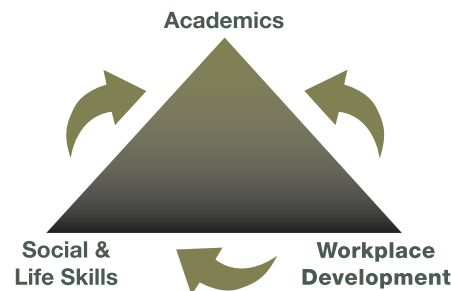

Passport: The Program for Unique Learners

➤ **Passport** is a comprehensive model program with a strategy for student success that begins with a focus on the whole person in three critical domains: Academics, Social and Life Skills, and Workplace Development. The program was the first accredited degree program in the nation for students challenged with intellectual and learning disabilities and was tested at a community college in Washington State. The **Passport** curriculum is appropriate for high school Transition programs, college certificate or degree

programs, private academies, public schools, charter schools, homeschooling organizations, educational start-ups or residential programs. The Passport curriculum has over 50 courses and accompanying Administrative Resource Guides. **All courses and Administrative Resource Guides are downloadable digital transactions for a quick and easy purchase process.
